Founded in 1925 by oilman Frank Phillips, Woolaroc includes a 3,700 acre wildlife preserve, a historic lodge home, and a 50,000 square foot world-class museum with a collection described by Christie's of New York as "one of the finest collections of southwest art in the world". Bison, elk, longhorns, and scotch highland cattle are just a few of the many varieties of animals located on the preserve. The Mountain Man Camp and the Animal Barn are open seasonally, and hiking trails are accessible year-round on our main grounds. Woolaroc has something for everyone, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Will Rogers once said, 'When you are visiting the beauty spots of this country, don't overlook Frank Phillips' ranch and game preserve in Bartlesville, Oklahoma. It's the most unique place in this country.'
