

Ride Schedule

- Shoes on your horses are recommended.
- Riding is prohibited except during the ride.
- No riding double or riding bareback.
- Kicking horses must be flagged with red on their tail.
- No stallions.
- Do not pass trail leaders. Any exceptions could cause confusion to the people behind and endanger riders.
- No littering, smoking or alcohol permitted.
- No pets on the trail.

Accommodations at Woolaroc

Overnight camping is available Friday night prior to the ride near the front gate. The camping area is in a primitive wildlife preserve with roaming buffalo and elk. Port-a-potties will be provided and water is accessible 200 feet from the camp. No electricity is available.

For camping Saturday night there is a \$10.00 fee.
